

Counting the homeless in Adelaide

Bulletin

August 12, 2008

This report summarises results from the fourth Inner City Homeless Count, held on 12 August 2008.

These counts are part of a strategy to monitor trends in primary homelessness or 'rough sleeping' in the Adelaide inner city area. Previous counts were conducted on the 19th June and 21st August 2007 and 13th May 2008. The Counts are conducted as a collaboration between the Department for Families and Communities, the Social Inclusion Unit and key homeless services in the inner city: Street to Home, Byron Place Day Centre, Westcare Day Centre and Hutt Street Day Centre.

The data reported in this Bulletin was collected in the morning or early afternoon of August 12 (see Appendix for survey questionnaire). In the early morning, Street to Home visited the parklands and other locations known to be frequented by people sleeping in unsheltered arrangements and asked if they would be willing to answer the questions in the survey. Meanwhile, the three Day Centres approached all people attending their services that day and invited their participation. The methodology for the count was very similar to that used by the ABS in the 2006 Census (ie, the same agencies were involved in the collection of data and similar collection strategies were used).

This Bulletin summarises data in relation to the 59 people who were in primary homelessness, ie unsheltered or sleeping rough on the day of the count, in comparison to those who were in other accommodation arrangements (excluding those who were in their own home).

Accommodation of all participants

291 people were counted in contact with participating services on 12th August. 59 of these were unsheltered (Table 1). No information about housing status was available for 32 people who declined to be part of the survey. Given the focus of the Count on people who are homeless or marginally housed, the 99 people in their own home and the 32 unknown have not been included in the analysis in this Bulletin.

Trends




Figure 1: Inner City Counts, number of participants and homeless - unsheltered

Compared to the previous three surveys, there were fewer people in contact with the participating services on the day of the August 2008 count. There has been a decline in the number of *unsheltered* persons over the four counts whilst numbers in *other accommodation* have remained relatively stable (Figure 1).

Current accommodation

Two thirds of the 59 *unsheltered* people were staying in the streets or the parklands, with all but four in the Adelaide city area (Table 2 and Table 3). The category of *other accommodation* includes a range of short-stay arrangements, the majority of which could be categorised as secondary or tertiary homelessness. The most common housing for people in this group was in a Boarding House.

Recent housing history

Participants were asked how long they had been staying in their current accommodation (Table 4 and Table 5). The median length of stay was 12 weeks for those who were *unsheltered*, ranging from less than a week to 29 years (one person). The median length of stay for those in *other accommodation* was 4 weeks, with a range from one day to 7 years.

Respondents were asked to indicate where else they had been staying in the last twelve months to provide an indication of recent housing history¹. This information was provided by 50 in *unsheltered* circumstances and 100 in *other accommodation*. 5 of the *unsheltered* group indicated they had been in their own house or flat at some time in the last twelve months (compared to 12 in *other accommodation*.) 44% of those in *other accommodation* experienced primary homelessness at some time in the past twelve months (Table 6).

*A person could indicated more than one type of accommodation used in the last twelve months

Around half of the people in *unsheltered* circumstances indicated they had used another type of accommodation (ie aside from unsheltered) in the last twelve months (Table 7). Around 70% in *other accommodation* indicated they used another type of accommodation (ie not their current accommodation type) in the last twelve months.

Note: accommodation history was not stated for 9 people in unsheltered and 1 person in other accommodation

Respondents were asked to identify the housing type in which they had spent most time over the past year (Table 8). 37% of the respondents (59 people) from both accommodation groups combined stated they had spent most time over the past twelve months in primary homelessness.

² It should be noted that only moves between accommodation types, rather than within accommodation types, was recorded, which means an undercounts of moves may be possible. For example, an individual could have moved between a number of different boarding houses, but only one accommodation type (a boarding house) was recorded.

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Most respondents had spent most of the last twelve months in the Adelaide metropolitan area (Table 9). Of the 23 who had spent most of the last twelve months interstate, 10 were from NSW and 5 from Victoria (Table 10).

Demographics

Table 11 and Table 12 provide demographic profiles of the two groups. The groups were very similar in terms of gender, cultural background and country of birth, although those who were *unsheltered* tended to be younger than those in *other accommodation*.

Only one respondent currently had children living with them: this man was living in a boarding house with two children.

Multiple service usage

One third of both groups said they had used or intended to use another inner city service on the day of the Count (20 of the *unsheltered*, 36 of those in *other accommodation*). Westcare was the service most frequently cited, followed by the Salvation Army and Hutt Street.

Individual identifiers

As in previous surveys, all respondents were asked if they were willing to have an individual identifier recorded on the form (initials; year of birth; gender). 192 (66%) of the total respondents (including those in their own homes) provided this identifier. 35 (18%) of these were currently in *unsheltered* circumstances and 80 (42%) were in *other accommodation*. 59% of the respondents in *unsheltered* circumstances and 79% in *other accommodation* provided an identifier.

Only four respondents in this survey had participated in all three previous surveys (Table 13).
